## CROSBY RAVENSWORTH SHOWS 150 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ YEAR

Crosby Ravensworth show was first started in 1856 as a flower show, this was the first village show in Westmorland. By 1875 the show had grown to be a full blown "floral and Horticultural Society" with vegetables and flowers displayed in large marquees. In later years poultry classes were introduced along with root and corn crops.
After the war years the show was revived in 1948 when horses, cattle, sheep and horticulture were the main classes.
The year 2002 saw the vintage section introduced which has been very popular.

Over the last few years, although very well supported with entries, our show has struggled for committee members and helpers. As it stands at present we do not have a secretary. If anyone fancies a low paid job, this would be very helpful.

The $150^{\text {th }}$ Crosby Ravensworth Show planned for $25^{\text {th }}$ August 2022 has been talked about for a number of years with ideas being filed from previous meeting to be filtered through as the event came closer. Covid 19 has thrown the enthusiasm out of sync with memento being lost and less volunteers turning up to the planning meetings. At a recent meeting it was agreed to hold a scaled back version of what had been originally planned, with commemorative rosettes and prize tickets to mark the occasion.
Following the successful covid cautious 2021 show, with no industrial classes, attendees agreed to hold a similar event in 2022 but with the addition of a small marquee for industrial and horticultural classes. A spokesman said a handful of volunteers have come forward to plan the show, it's highly likely that the community are unaware that 2022 is the year to celebrate the $150^{\text {th }}$ show, where prize winners will be awarded the special rosettes and prize tickets.

Sadly with no show secretary, we are seeking out volunteers to help on show day and asking the committee members to take on more responsibility for certain section of the show. Offers of help have come forward but volunteers have made it clear this is only a temporary solution.

A meeting is to be held on Wednesday $8^{\text {th }}$ of June at 7-30 in Crosby Ravensworth Village Hall where volunteers who are able to offer some assistance will be made most welcome. Contact the chairman Brian Bowness on 01931-715239

## NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL

It's now half term but whilst the children are enjoying a week's break, there's lots to tell you as the diary is getting very full! Class 2 are pleased to have finished their SATS papers, being tested in Maths and English (spelling, punctuation, grammar and reading). The staff are glad that they are over too as during that week, they lost their staff room! The Year 6s got the full VIP treatment meeting in the staff room when they arrived at school to have toast and juice and relax before the tests began. Whilst you are getting ready to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with the various teas, picnics and get togethers planned in our local community, we had our celebrations just before finishing for half term. Children came to school dressed in red, white and blue and made lots of bunting to decorate the hall where they later enjoyed a 'good old' Jubilee lunch....Cumberland sausage baps with Queen Elizabeth biscuits for afters. We also planted a hazel tree to commemorate this important anniversary.
