

### NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL

Well as you are reading this, the children will be enjoying their well deserved Easter holidays before the start of the Summer term, so we just wanted to update you with some of the events which happened before the end of term.

Unfortunately, we had a few cases of Covid in school and with the increase in cases in the wider community this led to the community Easter Lunch being cancelled. However the children still had fun, taking part in an Easter egg hunt, the Easter Bonnet Competition and the best decorated egg competition.

The planned residential at Hawes End, in Keswick for years 5 and 6 was still able to go ahead. Although the children missed their classmates, they really enjoyed making new friends and engaged in all the activities which ranged from archery, walking up Catbells to canoeing and ghyll-scrambling. They all had lots to tell their parents on their return. There are lots of photos on the school's website and facebook page so please take a look.

We were also pleased to welcome Jane Yates from Cumbria SACRE (Cumbria Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education). She spoke to all the children and introduced them to the idea of 'World Views'. The aim is to get children thinking about things from the point of view of others and promote ideas such as community and compassion which are central to our school philosophy. Other small schools in the county were able to join us by Zoom.

Andi Taylor continued with the art workshop with class 2 and assisted the children with finishing their special project on printing.

The children also carried out some important environmental work by planting some native tree saplings in the field adjoining the northern end of the playground under the guidance of David and Sylvia Evans. The plantation is temporarily shielded by fencing whilst a hedging of hawthorn grows around it but this will provide a shelter belt for animals as well as protection for the saplings as they grow. It is lovely to think the future generations of children will enjoy

visiting this nature area when studying habitats and eco-systems in science lessons.

New after school clubs are planned for after the break but Treasure Hunters this term proved popular. The children were able to have a go with a metal detector and all found 'treasure' ranging from a 1p coin to a watering can head and even a toy car!
