NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL.

The children are now enjoying their Easter break after what has been a busy end to the term.

Celebrating World Book Day was a great success. We even got our photo of the children and staff in their amazing costumes in the Herald! We had also encouraged the children to send in photos of them reading in unusual places and we received some great ones, such as reading whilst sat on a huge pile of logs, reading whilst crossing the river on stepping stones, reading whilst sat outside a bedroom window (not quite on the roof!), even reading to a cow and reading underwater!



The Easter Community Lunch was a sell out and those lucky enough to get a ticket tucked in to a two course delicious lunch prepared by Freda. The children then entertained parents and visitors with music (helped by Carolyn) and showed off their Easter bonnets. There was also a `decorate an egg`

competition. Those who attended described it as the `loveliest of afternoons`.

Children in class 1 got to learn about the work which firefighters do when a fire engine visited school (by arrangement rather than an emergency). The children enjoyed putting the special helmets on and using the water hose. They also got to see inside the fire engine and look at some of the other equipment firefighters use.

Children in Class 2 have been looking at how artists use art to convey messages, from Ancient Maya to modern day street art. They have explored imagery, symbols, expressive mark making amongst other techniques used and then went on to create their own powerful drawings to make their voices heard. Just one example.....



Then just before the end of term, the older children went to Hawse End to join other local schools on a residential trip. After mastering making their own bed, they did lots of activities, such as climbing Catbells, ghyll scrambling, a night walk alongside Derwent Water and archery to name but a few.

So, after the break, we will be in the summer term with more exciting opportunities planned.....the children in class 2 have a rugby session/tournament at Upper Eden Rugby Club to look forward to.




