For the people living in the North Westmorland group of parishes and surrounding areas, The Fellrunner Village Bus Company have again kindly offered to provide a 16 seater bus for community use this year, and a list of the proposed trips is given below. If you would like to make a booking, please contact **Mike Roulson on 01931 714457** to enquire if seats are available. Please note for some visits there will be an entrance charge payable as well as the bus fare.

March 2nd....Richmond and Mainsgill. Another trip to this popular town with its charming market place and shops, and later a visit to Mainsgill for further retail therapy in the farmshop and a bite to eat in the tearoom.

April 6th...A visit to Quarry Bank Mill, Styal, Manchester. Discover the story of the life of the young apprentices and other people working in the cotton mill in the 19th century. This site is managed by the National Trust and entrance charges for non members will apply.

May 11th....Fountains Abbey and the stunning Studley Royal Water Garden. Britain's largest and oldest monastic ruin, now a World Heritage site. Learn what life would have been like for the monks in the 16th century. Call in the visitor centre ,visit the cafe , gift shop, and the Fountains Mill where the grain was turned into flour. The site is managed by the National Trust and entrance charges will apply.

June 1st....Holehird Gardens, Windermere. A 10 acre garden managed by the Lakeland Horticultural Society, and an award winning RHS Partner garden, in a stunning setting overlooking Windermere. Entrance by donation.

July 6th....Whitby, the well known seaport on the east coast. A visit to this popular seaside resort famous for its fish and chips and home of the Whitby jet. Always a popular destination.

August 3rd....Barnard Castle, the historic market town in the Durham Dales. Followed by an afternoon visit to Eggleston Hall gardens. The garden specialises in rare and unusual plants and the Coach House cafe and gift shop are nearby. Small charge for garden entry.

September 7th...Hartlepool, the seaside port on the east coast. Here we will visit the "Trincomalee"at the Royal Navy National Museum and a chance to go on board this lovely old ship built in India at the end of the Napoleonic wars. On the waterfront, travel back in time and experience life in the 1700's. Entry charges will apply.

September 21st...Grassington and the 1940's weekend. A visit to this lovely Yorkshire town to experience life during war time Britain. Live music, vintage vehicles, displays, battle re-enactments and other entertainment.

October 5th....A visit to Whitehaven, the historic port on the west coast of Cumbria known for the Beacon Museum, The Rum Story; possibly take a walk around the harbour area.

November 2nd....York, the historic cathedral city in north Yorkshire, and the well known shopping area of "The Shambles". Discover the ancient Snickelways in the old city area.

December 7th...Barton Grange for all your Christmas shopping, followed by a visit to Blackpool and a trip through the illuminations, the largest free light show in the world. We will leave Morland late morning and return during the evening.


