Brenda passed away a number of years ago, but John came back to visit & catch up with his many friends he had in our Parish.


He was a truly pleasurable man to know, speaking personally.

Holly Cottage, Crosby Ravensworth

The work on Holly Cottage, Crosby Ravensworth, Ted Relph's old house has begun in earnest.

It needs extensive refurbishment with new drains, plumbing, electrics, and an air source heat pump requiring pipework under new insulated floors and lime plastering inside and out.

The aim is to conserve the feel of the old property, while introducing environmental changes to bring it into the 21st century and make it a lovely sustainable home with minimum maintenance in the future. So there is plenty to do over the next few months!

The Parish Council owns the house following a bequest from Ted, and will rent out the property to "a worthy local family" (the words of Ted's Will!) Any proceeds in the future will be used for the benefit of the community. On completion of the refurbishment, the Parish Council plan to hold an Open House event before advertising it locally - they are not operating a waiting list.



Either call in at the house or go to the box.


