The following is an extract from our Rector Stewart's recent letter to his local churches and wider church interests:

'I am sad to announce that my time as your Rural Dean and Mission Community leader is drawing to a close. It was announced in our churches this morning that the Bishop has appointed me to an Archdeacon's role in the west of the Diocese. The Venerable Richard Pratt and I will be job-sharing the role of Archdeacon of West Cumberland and jointly leading a new initiative called "New Start", aimed at providing targeted assistance to rejuvenate post-industrial town parishes along the West Coast.

Details are still being finalised, but it is anticipated that my final service in the benefice will be our joint service on Sunday 9 January 2022, after which we will be moving back to the Solway.

However, the PCC wants to assure you that although we are disappointed to be losing Stewart and Carolyn after 11 years, it will be business as usual at St Lawrence. We wish them, and Olivia and Gregor, well.

Reagill Village Hall

We are ready to welcome overnight visitors to Reagill Village Hall. The building was formerly the oldest school in Westmorland (founded over 400 years ago) and it has undergone a gradual programme of modernisation. It is community run and holds a special place in the hearts of generations of villagers. We can now provide a fully fitted kitchen with a new cooker, new fridge and microwave. There are a variety of heating options including overhead electric heaters on a meter and two multi stove heaters. Extra logs can be purchased at £5 per bag. You can be assured of a really warm and cosy stay.

There's an inside disabled toilet and another one outside. We will have a 'power' shower fitted by early October. There are blow up beds for four adults and two children (one double, two twin and two children's) and two camp beds and a camping mat (thank you Andrew). Any additional guests may be able to bring sleeping mats and sleep on the floor. Bring your own bedding.

There is a yard outside and the garden area has now been strimmed. Reagill has no street lights, by choice and, on a clear night, the stars can be seen.

We charge £12 per night per person with a minimum charge of £25 for a night.

The hall is not available on Monday nights during term time and we have a regular booking in the middle of the day for outdoor enthusiasts to have their lunch from 16 October to 1 February. During the Christmas period there will be private bookings and a booking for the Reagill Christmas Party. Please contact me for availability. Play area consultation

Crosby Ravensworth play area was built in 2000 it is looking it's age and very much in need of an upgrade. The play area consultation coffee morning was attended by a wide age range of villagers, Mums, Dad's, Grannies, Grandad and Great Grandad. Plans and a quote from the Cumbrian company Playdale were on display along with a great many photos of the community working together to prepare the site. A questionnaire was available at the coffee morning, the results show that all the respondents value the play area and support the refurbishment plans, the evidence from the questionnaires will be used when applying for grants. We are obliged to have three quotes before we can apply for grant applications, a second quote and plans from Wicksteads are expected by the end of October, the third quote and plans from Hags, are expected in November. Members of the group have been sourcing suitable grants to kick start the fundraising. Joan Raine

Maulds Meaburn Village Green

Concern has been raised with Eden District Council about the number of dogs being exercised off a lead, and without proper control from the owner, within Maulds Meaburn village. We are hoping that by bringing it to the attention of dog walkers that more consideration will be given to those that do not want to be approached by an unknown dog. When off a lead, extra attention is needed to ensure that all fouling is seen and therefore picked up. If left, it is a hazard to both people and livestock which graze the open green. Roaming (straying) dogs are also a hazard to all and pose a particular danger to animals and vehicles. The Environmental Enforcement team* will be visiting the village going forward, but if anyone would like to contact us separately, including to report a roaming dog, you can do so by emailing pollution@eden.gov.uk or by calling 01768 817817 during normal office hours.

NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL

We have lots to tell you this month.....

We all enjoyed our school's Harvest Festival Service last month and were pleased to celebrate it with our families and members of the community again too.

In school, a trainee teacher, Miss McShane, has joined us from the University of Cumbria and will be helping in class 2. Class 2 are enjoying their cookery lessons with Mrs Corrie on a Wednesday and already there are some budding chefs in the making. Continuing with their topic of sustainable food, the children visited Raisgill Hall Farm in Orton last month where they learnt about dairy farming. Later in the month there was also a visit from Dave Morland, head butcher to the Westmorland Group, who showed the children how Cumberland sausages are made and then made 'pigs in blankets' with them. Dave of course is now a 'TV star' after the recent channel 5 documentary. In the class room the children have been working hard on learning their times tables using a popular web based learning group 'Times tables Rockstars'.

Class 1 has also been busy. The children have been busy recycling cardboard boxes from home and making their own vehicles. They also had an exciting trip to the Motor Museum, Haverthwaite Railway Station and the Windermere Steamer, so three different modes of transport in one day!

The whole school got together on 20th October and took part in a number of different activities on the theme of a 'World without Judgement'. This was especially important as October has been 'Black History Month'.

Our breakfast and afterschool clubs continue to run with activities ranging from Craft Club, Acrobatics and Razzmatazz to 'High Seas Adventure' and Football. The clubs mean that we are able to provide wrap around care from 8am to 5pm.

Secondly to Linda White, our Chair of Governors who has recently stepped down from the Governing Body. Linda moved up to Cumbria in 2017 and wanting to involve herself in the local community became a school governor. She has been a frequent visitor and a familiar face to the children, attending the school community lunches and events as well as to fulfil her responsibilities as a governor. On relinquishing her

Crake Trees Manor wetland creation and river restoration — making better places for people and wildlife

For those of you that live in and around Crosby Ravensworth and Maulds Meaburn, you may have seen the diggers and dumpers moving around at Crake Trees Manor Farm and be wondering what is going on. Lev Dahl, River Restoration Manager at river conservation charity Eden Rivers Trust explains:

Eden Rivers Trust (ERT) has been working closely with Mike and Ruth Tuer, the owners of Crake Trees and other partners to undertake an ambitious and exciting programme of river restoration and wetland creation that will benefit people and wildlife.

About the Crake Trees Manor project

The project will see the creation of nine wetland areas and 11 ponds, planting of around 500 trees, restoration of 600m of the Micklebank Syke and Howe Beck (two important headwater tributaries of the river Lyvennet) and reconnection of the channel with the floodplain in key areas. As well as creating a huge range of habitats for a diverse array of wildlife (from wading birds such as curlew, lapwing and oystercatcher, to newts, toads, otter, bats and many more), there will be significant natural flood management (NFM) benefits.

Working with nature to reduce the risk of flooding

By devoting a large area to wetlands and ponds, Crake Trees Manor Farm will be able to store over 20,000m³ of water in times of high rainfall. That's 20 million litres of water that isn't making it into the rivers during times of high flow and contributing to downstream flooding. In addition, the river restoration and reconnection of the floodplain, combined with the tree planting, will slow the flow of the water that isn't being stored in the ponds, further reducing that downstream flood risk.

It's a team effort

Projects such as these are at the core of what Eden Rivers Trust do, but they would not be possible without people such as Mike and Ruth who are willing to give areas of land to make space for water and wildlife for the benefit of everyone.

Also integral to a project such as this are the partners that enable such works to happen.

The main partner is the Environment Agency, who not only provide most of the funding for this project, but also a wealth of advice and assistance.

The remainder of the funding has been secured thanks to the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme which is supported by a grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This means that this project will also form part of a much larger, landscape scale approach that will

unlock and reveal the hidden heritage of the Westmorland Dales, enabling more people to connect with, enjoy and benefit from this inspirational landscape.

Other partners and stakeholders include Natural England (advice and assistance), Dynamic Rivers Ltd. (feasibility and design work), Michael Morley and Nicola Chappelhow (principal contractor), Cumbria County Council (permitting and advice), Yorkshire Dales National Park (archaeological advice and assistance) and more still to come.


